DOCTRINAL THEOLOGY

DOCTRINE I (Required)

This course covers the basics of Lutheran Christian doctrine as presented in Luther's Catechism.

DOCTRINE II (Required)

This course continues the study of Lutheran Christian doctrine emphasizing Law and Gospel, Justification and Sanctification, the doctrine of Christ and the Means of Grace. (Prerequisite – Doctrine I)

COMPARATIVE THEOLOGY (Required)

This course will review Lutheran doctrine comparing it with the teachings of other faiths both Christian and non-Christian.

CONTEMPORARY ISSUES IN THEOLOGY

This course will explore contemporary theological issues and the theological dimensions of social issues.

HISTORICAL THEOLOGY

HISTORY OF THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH TO 1500

This course introduces the student to the discipline of church history and summarizes the thought and life of the Christian Church from its beginnings to the conclusion of the Medieval period and the beginnings of the modern era.

LUTHERAN HISTORY - 1500 TO PRESENT

This course presents the Medieval roots of Lutheranism, the life of Luther, and the story of Lutheranism into the 21st century.

LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS (Required)

This course is a study of the theology and development of the Lutheran Confessions designed to increase student's knowledge of the theological heritage and doctrinal stance of the Lutheran Church.

READINGS IN LUTHER

This course focuses on a close reading of a major text by Martin Luther. It will be studied in its historical context and its place in Lutheran history and theology.

CATALOG OF COURSES

For Lay Ministry Training

LCMS NEW JERSEY DISTRICT

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INTRODUCTION TO THE HOLY SCRIPTURES (Required)

This course will familiarize the student with the historical and geographical background of the Scriptures.

INTRODUCTION TO THE OLD TESTAMENT (Required)

This course will familiarize the student with Old Testament history and literature. The course will explore the roots of the Messianic message in prophecy and emphasize covenantal themes and God's progressive revelation of His plan of Salvation.

INTRODUCTION TO THE NEW TESTAMENT (Required)

This course will familiarize the student with the Life of Christ, the journeys of Paul, and the Epistles. This course will focus on the centrality of the Cross and the Resurrection of Jesus.

INTRODUCTION TO HERMENEUTICS (Required)

This course will familiarize the student with the fundamental principles of biblical interpretation. The student will develop skills in using biblical resources including concordances, dictionaries, word studies, commentaries and various translations in order to analyze and interpret biblical passages.

GOSPEL OF JOHN

This course focuses on John's proclamation of Jesus' message of Resurrection and John's unique method of writing about the truth of the Son of God as Savior of the world.

ROMANS

This course will focus on Paul's theology of the cross and the doctrine of justification as the basis of Christian theology.

REVELATION OF ST. JOHN

This course will familiarize the student with the Book of Revelation in which St. John receives, by the power of the Holy Spirit, the most magnificent vision of Heaven.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

PRACTICAL THEOLOGY

INTERPERSONAL SKILLS

The purpose of this course is to develop the skills in conflict resolution and other interactions within a church setting and other areas of ministry.

INTRODUCTION TO TEACHING

The purpose of the course is to assist the Sunday School teacher, Adult Bible Class teacher, and Lay Minister to know and apply effective teaching methods.

LUTHERAN WORSHIP (Required)

This course will enable the student to demonstrate a competence in understanding and explaining the "Why's" of Lutheran worship. The student will learn how to plan and conduct worship services, and/or devotions.

<u>HOMILETICS</u> (Required)

This course will enable the student to work through a Biblical text for the purpose of sermon preparation in the presentation of the Gospel. (Prereq. Intro to O.T. and N.T., Hermeneutics, Doctrine I and Doctrine II)

EVANGELISM & WITNESS IN MODERN & POSTMODERN CONTEXTS

The purpose of this course is to develop skills to share Jesus Christ in a caring and loving manner in the 21st century.

SUPPORT AND CARING MINISTRY

This course sensitizes the student in ministering to the sick, the dying, shut-ins, the handicapped, and others with special needs.

YOUTH MINISTRY

This course seeks to develop an effective Youth Ministry in a parish setting.

CHURCH MUSIC: CHOOSING WHAT & WHEN; USING WHY & HOW

This course will give worship planners the tools with which to choose music for worship by thinking theologically as well as missiologically as they work in either a traditional or contemporary setting.

MESSAGE FROM THE NJ DISTRICT PRESIDENT

The Christian life involves trusting our God and Savior to do as He promised to forgive our sins and love us with an unconditional eternal love. CHURCH WORKER PROGRAM

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Church Worker Program makes it possible for any New Jersey District lay person to learn to grow and to effectively serve the Lord in a local congregation.

For example, an elder, church secretary, or parish worker may wish to improve skills in the area of Christian doctrine or interpersonal skills; a Sunday School teacher may want to learn Bible Study skills or take a teaching course; an organist may want to learn more about Lutheran worship; or lay persons may just want to take a particular course of interest to them.

This program provides the opportunity to simply "learn more." The key requirement is the desire to do just that. Upon successful completion of any course a Certificate of Completion may be given recognizing that individual's accomplishment.

Lay Ministry Certification

- + Endorsed by the local parish
- + A copy of one of the following: High School Transcript, GED, High School Diploma
- + For certification, student must successfully complete 12 Required and 3 elective courses

Church Worker Program

- + The desire to enhance skills in a specific area
- + Ability and desire to do college level work

ENROLLMENT PROCEDURES

- A \$15 one time non-refundable fee must accompany initial application.
- Tuition for each course is \$150 and must accompany registration.
- Registration should be made 10 days prior to the first class of each course. Courses with fewer than 7 students enrolled may be cancelled one week prior to the first class session.
- Obtaining text books and other materials are the responsibility of the student.

NEW JERSEY DISTRICT LAY MINISTRY CERTIFICATION

This Program is for lay persons who desire to obtain professional Certification in order to provide ministry to congregations in the LCMS New Jersey District. It will lead to the certification **LAY MINISTER** in the New Jersey District. A Lay Minister serves under the supervision of an ordained pastor. Upon meeting entrance requirements, both men and women are eligible for this program.

Lay ministers might serve in a variety of ways. They may serve as trained leaders in such areas as evangelism, worship, education, visitation, and youth ministry. In addition, some certified men may be called upon to preach or lead a public worship service. Both men and women will gain expertise and experience so that they will be able to take part actively in the work of our district and provide both visionary and practical leadership in carrying out our Lord's work.

Required courses for certification:

Lutheran Worship Homiletics Introduction to Holy Scripture Introduction to the Old Testament Introduction to the New Testament Introduction to Hermeneutics Doctrine I Doctrine II History of Christian Church to 1500 Lutheran History – 1500 to Present Lutheran Confessions Comparative Theology/Worldviews

It should be noted that this certification will apply only to the New Jersey District and is not the same as the LCMS Lay Ministry Certification.
